



The Harry Van Rhyn Memorial Scholarship

The Harry Van Rhyn (pronounced Van.Rhine') Memorial Scholarship was established in 1977 in memory of Harry Van Rhyn, C.P.M., who died in Nov. 1976. Harry was a very strong and effective leader in CAPM, serving in many capacities, including President in 1970-71. He also served on the NAPM Board of Directors as the Vice President from the New England District 9.

The Harry Van Rhyn Memorial Scholarship is available to High School graduates who are entering their first year of College.

CAPM awards a Harry Van Rhyn Memorial Scholarship to a member's son, daughter, or grandchild who is applying to college. To qualify for the scholarship, a student must have a parent or grandparent who is a member in good standing of CAPM, be a senior in high school, and apply as follows:

1. Sign up for the SAT exams given in Connecticut. SAT exams must have been taken by Jan. 1 of the year of high school graduation.
2. Sign and present to the school principal or guidance counselor a release form, which may be obtained from the CAPM office by calling 203-488-2456. The release form requests a copy of your Student Transcript (the SAT scores must be noted on the Transcript).
3. Send the CAPM Scholarship Committee a 500-word autobiographical essay stating why you are applying for the scholarship, the name of your CAPM-member parent or grandparent, and your home address and phone number. Also attach a summary of your school and outside activities.

The scholarship award will be based on scholastic achievement (high school marks, rank in class, SAT scores) and supplementary activities. If multiple scholarship awards are offered by CAPM, only one scholarship award will be made to the immediate family.

Applications must be fully completed and be postmarked no later than March 1. Please retain for your records a copy of all information you send to the Scholarship Committee. Award of the scholarship will be made at the CAPM Awards Banquet to be held in May. The award check will be made payable to the accredited college (where the student has been accepted) for the student's account. Review of applications and selection of recipient will be made by a professional consultant; not by the Scholarship Committee.

The May D. Warzocha Memorial Scholarship



The May D. Warzocha (pronounced War'zo'ka) Memorial Scholarship was established in 1990 in memory of CAPM's and NAPM's first woman President. May D. Warzocha, C.P.M., was CAPM President in 1971-72 and NAPM President in 1979-80. She also received the highest honor bestowed by NAPM, the Shipman Gold Medal Award in 1986. She received CAPM's highest honor, the Fred A. Harvey Award, in 1979. May died in April 1990.

The May D. Warzocha Memorial Scholarship is available only to college students who are at least a sophomore, entering their junior or Senior Year in a 4 or 5 year program, or completing their 2nd year in a two year program.

CAPM awards a May D. Warzocha Memorial Scholarship to a member's son, daughter, or grandchild who is currently attending college and is (a) at least a sophomore; (b) completing his/her second year in a 2-year program; or (c) will be entering his/her junior or senior year in a 4- or 5-year undergraduate program. To qualify for the scholarship, a student must have a parent or grandparent who is a member in good standing of CAPM and apply as follows:

1. Send the CAPM Scholarship Committee a 500-word autobiographical essay stating why you are applying for the scholarship, the name of your CAPM-member parent or grandparent, and your home address and telephone number. Also attach a summary of your school and outside activities.
2. Sign and present to the school a release form, which may be obtained by calling CAPM at 203-488-2456. The release form requests a copy of your Student Transcript (with school seal) to be sent to the CAPM Scholarship Committee.
3. Have a faculty member send a letter of recommendation to the CAPM Scholarship Committee.

The scholarship award will be based on scholastic achievement (at the college level) and supplementary activities while attending college. If multiple scholarship awards are offered by CAPM, only one scholarship award will be made to the immediate family.

The Richard V. Bradshaw Memorial Scholarship

The Richard V. Bradshaw Memorial Scholarship was established in 2002. It is offered to each of the affiliates in the Northeast Supply Management Group of ISM (formerly the New England District 9 of NAPM). It is in memory of Northeast Supply Management Group colleague and former NAPM President, Richard V. Bradshaw, C.P.M., who lost his battle with cancer on Feb. 16, 2002.

Dick was President of NAPM in 2000-01 at a crucial time of transition in the Association's governance. He had previously held each elected position in the Purchasing Management Association of Boston and was Director of Purchasing for Boston University. He embodied the finest qualities of a professional and a volunteer.
